On motion of Nathaniel Jones, who made oath and together with Henry Moore and Nathan S. Thomas his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Robert J. Jones decd. in due form.

Ordered that Benjamin Moller, John Whitehead, William R. Robertson and James Turner or any three of them, being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do appraise all the personal estate of Robert J. Jones decd. and return the appraisement under their hands to this Court.

On motion of Herbert Sanier who made oath and together with Jesse L. Bailey and John A. Hill, his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Sally Carrell decd. in due form.

Ordered that Jesse L. Bailey, John A. Hill, William B. Bailey and Alfred J. Bortle or any three of them, being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do appraise all the personal estate of Sally Carrell decd. and return the appraisement under their hands to this Court.

On the petition of William S. Everett for leave to open a new Road from the Malay Bridge Road, South of Flat Swamp bridge to run to Boykin's Bridge Rail-road Mare house, The Commissioners of Roads to whom the application was referred this day made an additional report which is ordered to be recorded, and is as follows, "In addition to the report we have submitted to the Honorable Court of St. James, relative an intersecting road from Malay's Bridge road to Boykin's Bridge road bearing date the 15th day of August 1836 we do hereby certify that the parties whose Land said road is intended to run with the exception of Mr. John A. Person, one of the proprietors of the Land through which said road is to run came into Court and released all damages to which he might be entitled, in consequence of the said road running through his lands: This day came the petitioner and the Court upon consideration of said Report and of the evidence adduced, doth order that the said Road be opened as petitioned for (provided the costs of opening the said Road do not exceed the sum of two hundred dollars, and thereupon John A. Person, Nathan W. Thomas and Peter Edwards or any two of them are hereby appointed commissioners to let to the lowest bidder

Taken the opening of said Road, and left, that they receive the said Road.
