

County Court pronounced in this cause at December Court 1836, made this Report which is ordered to be recorded, and is as follows "In obedience to an interlocutory decree of the County Court of Southampton, at December Court 1836, your Commissioners having divided the slaves belonging to Elizabeth J. Gardner at her death, between the distributees, namely, the guardian of Barbara B. Gardner and Jacob H. Daughtrey the sons of Tabitha Robertson and by leave to report. Your Commissioners proceeded on Saturday the 31st day of December 1836, first to value the slaves in the bill mentioned namely:

Mike " " \$900
Harry " " \$200
Cherry " " 200
\$2,000

then placed since \$900 and Cherry \$200 in lot No 1. which was drawn by Samuel Daughtrey the guardian of Barbara B. Gardner. He also placed Mike \$900 and Harry \$200 in lot No 2. which was allotted to Jacob H. Daughtrey the sons of Tabitha Robertson and. The distributees by guardian &c. then executed bonds with security in as finally equals to twice the value of the share of each, payable to the representative of the said Elizabeth J. Gardner, conditioned to refund and proportions of any acts or demands which may hereafter arise against the said Elizabeth J. Gardner's estate together with the cost attending the same. All which is respectfully submitted. Given under our hands the 31st day of Decemr 1836. Jesse Parker. Hardy Rawls. Thereupon, by consent of parties, it is decreed and ordered that the division aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid, made be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties
