On the petition of John Ricks for leave to alter a Road running through his land, it is ordered that the application be referred to William D. Hood and Alfred Ricks, two of the Commissioners of Roads for this County, and that they view & report thereon according to Law.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Robt examine, state and settle an account of James Wick's administration on the estate of Henry Joyner decd and make report thereof to this Court with any matters specially stated, seems pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the petition of William S. Everett for leave to alter the road running through the lands of the heirs of Bolton Scarborough decd. The Commissioners of Roads to whom the application was referred this day made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows. "Agreeably to an order of the worshipful Court of Southampton County, obtained by William S. Everett Esqr. 14th. Court 1837. directed to William B. Nicholson and Thos B. Morrell two of the road Commissioners (and hereunto annexed) I have examined and surveyed the road where said Everett wishes the road to be removed, on the land of Mrs Margaret S. Nicholson (on whose land the present road is located) who is willing to the removal of said Road - and am of opinion that to locate the road as marked off (a diagram of which is herewith annexed) would be highly advantageous to said Everett, as it would considerably lessen the labor of fencing, - and would be very little disadvantage to the public as the distance would be only about two hundred yards further. The road as marked off measures eleven hundred and sixty yards and the land is nearly as eligible for a Road as where the present road is located. Respectfully submitted to the Court Given under my hand this 18th day of March 1837. Thos B. Morrell." And it is ordered that the said Everett have leave to alter the said road as specified for, and that when the new road is opened and put in legal repair the old road be discontinued.

On the motion of Joshua Presdon against Josiah Jolly. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the defendant has legal notice of this motion he was solemnly called but came not therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the sum of Fifty seven dollars and eighty seven cents with interest from the 2nd day of February 1837 till paid, the amount paid by the plaintiff to Benja Coggins for the benefit of Thomas Presdon by virtue of an execution issued by him against the plaintiff out of this Court upon a judgment rendered on a bond in which the plaintiff was the defendant's security, and also that the plaintiff recover against the defendant his cost by him in this behalf expended.
