Benjamin Griffin Gent. this day produced to the Court a Commission under the hand of the Lieutenant Governor (acting as Governor) of this Commonwealth with the seal of the Commonwealth thereto annexed, whereby he is commissioned to execute the office of Sheriff of this County until the first quarterly term of this Court for the next year, and who hath theretofore executed the bonds with security as required by Law; and the said Benjamin Griffin took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth; the oath against duelling; the oath to support the Constitution of the United States; and the oath of office.

Pope are permitted to qualify his deputies, the Court being of opinion that they are men of honesty probity and good demeanour.
