

Road by measurement is found to be 3036 yards being less than a mile and three quarters. This route will require some housewarming, all of which can be done at little expense, not exceeding in our opinion, forty dollars, and being mostly a pathway but little work will be necessary to render it a good Road. The annexed is a diagram of the road contemplated.

And the Court upon consideration of said Report as well as upon other evidence, is of opinion and accordingly order that the said road be opened as proposed; and that the said Road be twenty feet wide. And Harrison, Joseph, Jesse Parker & Jordan Edwards or any two of them are appointed Commissioners to let to the Court undertake the opening of said Road and when opened and put in legal repair receive it and make repair thereof to Court.

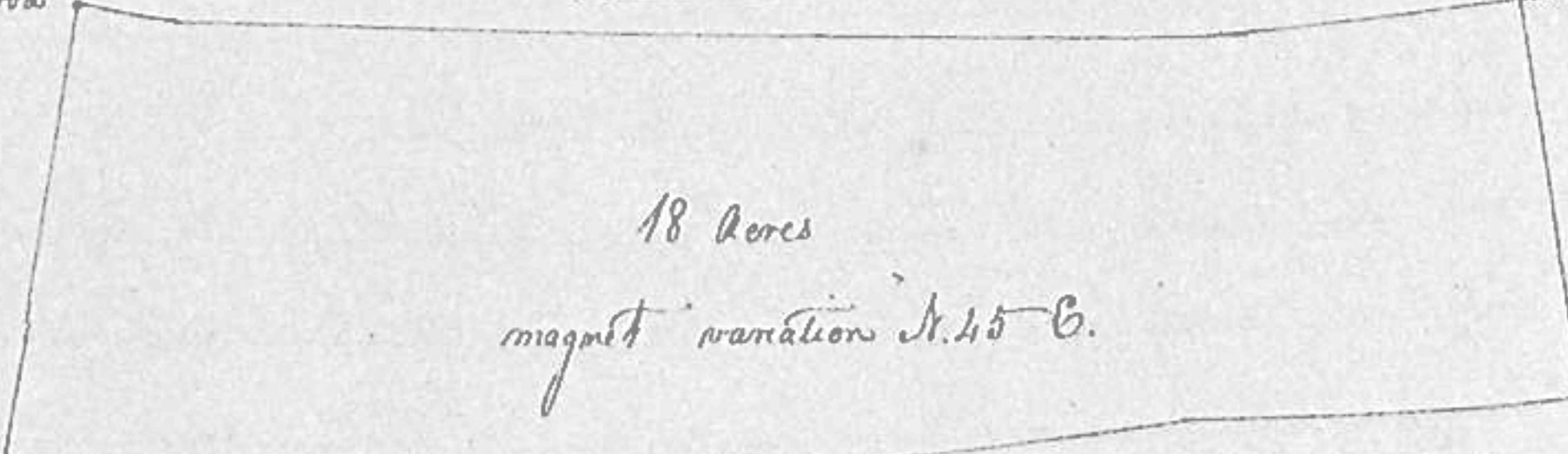
On the petition of Elizabeth Hines for leave to alter a Road, The Commissioners of Roads who viewed the way this day made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: "In compliance with an order of Court made September term 1836 for viewing a road which Mrs Elizabeth Hines wishes to turn, and on and on her petition to Court was referred to Commissioners of Roads we proceeded to examine the same and are of opinion that no inconvenience can result from the alteration, the route being some what shorter, more level, and after a little use, so as to settle the road, at least as good, if not a better one than the old route. And as there will be a considerable saving of fencing to Mrs Hines, the road proposed being thrown entirely out of the enclosed part of her plantation, which does away the necessity of keeping a lane through the same, and she having gone to the trouble of plowing and levelling the whole distance, as well as ditching, where necessary, to render the road dry, respectfully submitted to the Court this our report with the hope that her petition may be granted. Wm. D. Hood. Wm. Nicholson. March 28. 1837." And upon consideration thereof leave is given the petitioner to alter the road as proposed - and that the old road be discontinued from the time the new road is opened & put in good repair.

William D. Hood Surveyor of this County made a report of the survey of a piece of Land purchased by Henry Kinard for Taxes, which is approved of by the Court, and ordered to be recorded, and is as follows: "Below is a plat of Land containing 18 acres belonging to William Harrison and sold for taxes due on it at public auction in Jerusalem when Henry Kinard became the purchaser, for whom it was surveyed August 1835 commencing at a dogwood a corner of Humphrey Drevy and running S. 80° N. 7.20 a rod oak in Drevy's line So 20. N. 68° p. a red oak So 35° E. 19. 64 a black gum in branch S 85° N 27.18 in H Drevy's line N 26.76 - N 6 N 20. N 58° p a red oak & pine S 77° E. 10 S 87° E. 20.76 to the beginning. Wm. D. Hood. S.
