Sarah Dole widow of Wiley Dole

against
Jacob Senow by James Senow his next friend & guardian
This day came the parties by their counsel and the Commissioners appointed to act under an Interlocutory decree pronounced in this cause at the July Court 1836 made their report which is ordered to be recorded, and is as follows: "In conformity to the annexed decree, we the undersigned Commissioners did meet on the tract of Land mentioned in the decree and have by mutual agreement, laid off by proper metes and bounds one third part of said tract of Land having regard to quality as well as quantity, and allotted the same to Sarah Dole the widow of Wiley Dole, as and for her dower in the same the line running from a large white oak tree the orchard near the corner of the barn to a peach tree, thence to a persimmon tree, and thence to the road: and whereas the said plantation has been rented out for two or three years since the death of the said Wiley Dole, and the said Sally having claimed her right in said land, but was barred from the same in consequence of which she is entitled to a portion of the amount which accrued from the rent, and the parties having agreed, to leave it to the Commissioners to say what part Sarah Dole shall receive for rent, and the Commissioners having taken the same into consideration, do say that she ought to receive the sum of twenty four dollars from James Senow the guardian of said Senow in consequence of his keeping her out of her third part of the land. Given under our hand this 5th day of January 1837. Ben Griffin. James Clayton. John Dick. Commissioners." Whereupon by consent of parties, it is decreed and ordered that the division or allotment aforesaid, in manner and form as aforesaid made be held firm and stable, and forever binding between the parties.

On motion of Elizabeth Hines, ordered that Jeremiah Cobb, Edward Butts and William Briggs or any two of them view the road lately altered by the said Elizabeth Hines near her house and report to the court whether the said Road is in good legal repair.

On the petition of John McNeal, who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by Law and entered into bond with Thomas Newson his security, in the penalty of one hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the Law directs, a License is granted him to keep an ordinary at Newson's Depot in this County, until May Court next. The Court being satisfied that the said John McNeal is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

On the petition of Joseph M. Barham who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by Law and entered into bond with Alexander Jackson & Nathl. Frances his securities, in the penalty of one hundred and fifty dollars

conditioned as the law directs a License is granted him to keep an ordinary at Newson's Depot in this County, until May Court next. The Court being satisfied that the said Joseph M. Barham is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

On the petition of Thomas Newson to whom said application was referred, we the undersigned Commissioners public road near Newson's Depot exceed 300 yards. That the difference of the road is wholly on the one side; That the change will be to the public will not sustain the petition. Henry B. Vaughan

Whereupon the Court upon a view of the road as proposed, ordered that the said Road be opened and kept in good legal repair.
