On the petition of Thomas Newson for leave to alter the road near Newsons Depot - The Commissioners of Roads to whom said application was referred this day made their report which is ordered to be recorded, and is as follows: "Agreeable to an order of the County Court of Southampton bearing date 11th May 1837 and to us since then, we the undersigned Commissioners of Roads have proceeded to view the proposed alteration to be made in the public road near Newsons Depot, and report as follows; That the length of the proposed alteration does not exceed 300 yards, That the difference in the old and new Roads does not exceed, in our estimation 25 feet, That the road is wholly on the lands of Thomas Newson, That the new road will be as good as the old one; That the changes will be an improvement in the property of the Newsons at the Depot & that the public will not sustain the least inconvenience by the change, but we think will rather be benefited particularly in getting to the Depot. Whereupon the Court upon all the circumstances of the case is of opinion that the petitioner have leave to alter the road as proposed. And it is ordered that the old Road be discontinued from the time that the new Road is opened and put in good repair.

The Court being satisfied that the said Sampson C. Reese is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

On the petition of David Bedwin who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law and entered into bond with John Vicks his security, in the penalty of one hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs, a License is granted him to keep an ordinary at Jerusalem in this County, until the May Court next.
