That is to say, we reserved 5000 for the purpose of running a wall across the Rowing on the public square and the balance say 20,000 were purchased by Thomas H. Jones, he being the highest bidder, at 44.06 1/2 cents per thousand, making the sum of \$88.50 cents for which we have taken bond Security which is herewith returned - Given under our hands this 19th day of June 1837 - N. M. Sebell, L. R. Edwards." And it is further ordered that the bond accompanying said report be delivered to the Sheriff who is directed to collect it and account therefor with the Court.
