Therefore it is the opinion of the Court that the prisoner receive fifteen lashes on his bare back and that the Sheriff cause execution of this Judgment to be done in instant and the same being done it is ordered that the prisoner be discharged.

Blunt orphan of Samuel Blunt decd. with the approbation of the Court, made choice of Samuel Blunt for his Guardian; and thereupon the said Samuel Blunt together with Augustine Claiborne and George B.
