This day comes the parties by their counsel and the Commissioners appointed to act under an Interlocutory decree of this Court pronounced in this cause at the November Court 1830 made his Report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: "Pursuant to the annexed decree of the Commissioners named in said decree have sold to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months the slaves Negroes of Lucy Harris deceased, which the proceeds of sale amounts to 3736 dollars. I have reserved 30 dollars for the purpose of defraying all necessary expenses which leaves a balance of 3706 dollars, that sum being divided into eight parts amounts to 463 dollars & 95/100 cents to each Debtor. Three of them having become the purchasers of said Negroes, I thought it proper to take notes for their proportions they all being of full age therefore I have taken five bonds and three Recds. one bond of which I allot to Polly Harris one to William Teltt in right of his wife formerly Harris one to Gideon Harris and one to John Grizzard in right of his wife Sally formerly Jacob Harris having become a purchaser I have taken his receipt in full of his legacy. Lewis Harris having become a purchaser I have taken his Receipt also James Harris becoming a purchaser also I have taken his Recd. and the other bonds I retain in my own right this being the manner in which I have executed the above decree I humbly submit it to this Court Given under my hand this 15th day of July 1830 - Howell Harris Commissioner" Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the sale and division of said slaves in manner and form aforesaid be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.

Ordered that Master Commissioner shall examine state and settle an account between Sam'l Blundell & Simon J. Blundell orphans of Samuel Blundell deceased and make report thereof to this Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

Ordered that Master Commissioner shall examine state and settle an account of Benjamin Devany's administration on the estate of Elizabeth Fort deceased and make report thereof to this Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of Burwell Ricks Esq. against Mary J. Harrison. For reasons appearing to the Court this motion is continued until the next Court.

Abstent Joseph J. Claude Esq.

Ordered that Master Commissioner shall examine state and settle an account of Joseph J. Claude's Guardianship of Nancy and Narcissus Claude and make report thereof to this Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.
