This day came the parties by their counsel and the Commissioner appointed to act under an Interlocutory decree of this Court pronounced in this cause at the November Court 1836 made his Report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: "Pursuant to the annexed decree of the Commissioner named in said decree have sold to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months the slaves Negroes of Lucy Harris dead, which the proceeds of sale amounts to 3756 dollars. I have reserved 30 dollars for the purpose of defraying all necessary expenses which leaves a balance of 3726 dollars. That sum being divided into eight parts amounts to 465 dollars & 25 per cents to each legatee. Three of them having become the purchasers of said Negroes, I thought it proper to take notes for their proportions they all being of full age therefore I have taken five bonds and three notes, one bond of which I allot to Polly Harris one to William Telti in right of his wife formerly Harris one to Lewis Harris and one to John Griggard in right of his wife Polly formerly Joel Harris having become a purchaser I have taken his receipt in full of his legacy. Lewis Harris having become a purchaser I have taken his Receipt also James Harris becoming a purchaser also I have taken his Recd. and the three bonds I retain in my own right this being the manner in which I have executed the above decree I humbly submit it to this Court given under my hand this 15th day of July 1837. Howell Harris. Commissioner" Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the sale and divisions aforesaid in manner and form aforesaid be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.

Ordered that Master Commissioner both examine state and settle an account between said Plaintiff Executor of said Plaintiff Simon J. Blunt orphan of Samuel Blunt dead and make report thereof to this Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

Ordered that Master Commissioner both examine state and settle an account of Benjamin Sevan's administration on the estate of Elizabeth Fort dead and make report thereof to this Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of Burwell Bird Gale against Mary J. Harrison. For reasons appearing to the Court this motion is continued until the next Court.
