This day came the parties by their counsel, and the commissioners appointed to act under an interlocutory decree pronounced in this cause at the June term 1837, made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: "In obedience to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date June term 1837 and to us directed we the undersigned have proceeded to divide the Sands as herein directed, we allotted to John N. Williamson in right of his wife Ann formerly widow of William S. Rochelle and 23 acres as her dower in said land to Robert Rochelle 20 acres to Nathaniel Sands in right of his wife Mary formerly Mary Rochelle 20 acres and Stephen Mordaugh Guardian ad litem to the heirs of Nathaniel Rochelle and 25 1/2 acres, we charge \$5 for our services and which amounts to \$15. All of which is respectfully submitted to your Honors. Geo. A. M. Newson. Barham Town Henry Pelletier. Augt 21st 1837." Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the divisions aforesaid be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.

A Power of attorney from Charles Smith and Pelly his wife to Milton M. Smith was returned and together with the certificates annexed, ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the estate of Lydia Williams and be committed to the hands of Benjamin Griffin Sheriff of this County for administration according to Law.

Ordered that Robert Riches, William Davis, John Davis & James Williams or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do appraise all the personal estate of Lydia Williams and return the appraisement under their hands to this Court.

Ordered that Benjamin S. Drew, Robert Peltow and Edwin Willeford do, with the commissioners that have been appointed by the County Court of Isle of Wight, let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of Proctors Bridge across Blackwater, receive the same when completed, and make report thereof to this Court.

On the motion of Benjamin Ellis who made oath and together with Newit Drew and Henry Moore, his coventurers entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Three Thousand dollars, conditioned as the Law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Newit D. Powell and in due form.

Ordered that Newit Drew, Samuel Ellis, David Newson & John Sykes or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do appraise all the personal estate of Newit D. Powell and return the appraisement under their hands to this Court.

On the motion of William Jenkins who made oath and together with William B. Goodwyn and Spordley Williams his coventurers entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Thirty Thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of George A. C. Barham and in due form.

Ordered that Barham Newson, Solomon D. Parker, Henry Pelletier and Spordley Williams or any three of them being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do appraise all the personal estate of George A. C. Barham and return the appraisement under their hands to this Court.
