For Edwards Bull — the votes were, Samuel B. Hines, Thomas Pottow, Lewis Bowers, Joseph Toland Nicholas, M. Debelle, J. P. Parker, James Maget, Alexander Myrick, and Jacob Barnes.

For William S. Hood the votes were, James Clayton, James D. Maffenburg, William Briggs & Jeremiah Cobb. So Edwards Bull is also recommended to the Governor as a fit & proper person to be commissioned a Justice of the peace for this County.

By consent, The appeal granted Simon Marcell from the order of the court granting administration on the estate of Rebecca Beale deceased, and the order granting the guardianship of the estate to John E.
