The day came the parties by their counsels and the Commissioners appointed to act under an Interlocutory
decree pronounced in this cause at the July Court 1835 and which decree was subsequently amended at the March
Court 1836 and at the October Court 1836, made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows.
art. "By virtue of the annexed decree we the undersigned Commissioners appointed to sell the lands belonging

as aforesaid made be held as firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.
