This day came the parties by their attorney and the commissioners appointed to act under an Interlocutory Decree of this Court pronounced at the January Court 1837, made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: Agreeable to a Decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date January Court 1837 and hereunto annexed of the having advertised a Sunday place in the County for at least twenty days previous to the day of Sale as well as at many places out of the County, we have sold at public auction, on a credit of twelve months from the 17th day of February 1837 except enough to meet the expense of clerks and Lawyers fees and the said: the slaves Simas, Dory, Mary, and her child Georgiana, belonging to the heirs of Benjamin Washington decd and John Brown became the purchaser of Mary and child Georgiana for the sum of \$741- and John Brown became the purchaser of Dory for the sum of \$956- and Stephen H. Washington became the purchaser of Simas for the sum of \$250- amounting to in all \$1947-. We have in the first place deducted from the amt. of sales fifteen dollars to pay the clerk and Lawyers fees and the further sum of \$56.17 for commissioners for selling &c leaving a net balance due the heirs of \$1875.83 for which balance we have taken bonds for the following amounts for the following persons, to wit: One bond for Thomas Atkins for 468.95 1/2
One other bond for George Day Guardian to Elizabeth Ann Washington for 468.95 1/2
One other bond for Stephen H. Washington for 468.95 1/2
Two other bonds for George Day Guardian to Benjamin L. Washington 468.95 1/2
We have paid over the above mentioned bonds to the persons entitled to receive them and taken their receipts for the same as will appear on the other side of this report. Given under our hands this 11th day of March 1837. Ben L. Drew. John Brown.
Whereupon, by consent of parties, it is agreed and ordered that this date and division of assets in manner and form as aforesaid may be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.

On the petition of Jesse L. Bailey setting forth that he stands bound with Nicholas J. Bankham for his due and faithful administration on the estate of Prudence Bankham decd and that he conceives himself in danger of suffering thereby, and praying the Court for relief, it is ordered that the said Bankham be summoned to the next Court to show cause why he should not be ruled to give the said Bailey good Counter Security, or execute a new bond according to law.

Ordered That Thomas J. Barber, Patrick Dices, John Brown and James Clayton, or any three of them, let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the small bridge across to gut at the Lower Seavicks, receive the same when completed and make report thereof to this Court.

An authenticated copy of the last Will Testament of John Pledger decd was returned and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Fletcher Powell the Executor therein named, who made oath and together with Richard Potter and Nathl. Williams, his trustees, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form.

The Court fixes the fine to be assessed against persons who fail to attend to work on the Road when required at twenty five cents per day.

John S. Beal is appointed surveyor of the road leading by Capt. Vicks in the room of Goodwyn Niblet, discharged. It is ordered that the usual hands work thereon.

Williams Beal is appointed surveyor of the roads in the room of Elisha Joyner, excused, and it is ordered that the usual hands work thereon.

A Deed of lease from Margaret Story to Jane Holt was proved by the oath of Simon Musfer, Augustin Pope, and others. Musfer the witness thereto and ordered to be recorded.
