Deal in right of his wife Elizabeth late Turgason, one to Allen Hill in right of his wife Martha late Turgason, one to Matthias Embury in right of his wife Nancy late Turgason, one to William Turgason, one to Peter Turgason, one payable to Benja. Deal Guardian to Joshua Turgason. And the other share or seventh they have subdivided three equal parts and taken their bonds of the said William Turgason and David Bryant & Caleb Everett securities in the sum of twenty dollars & 61 cts each payable the 9th day of Oct. next to the four & on the benefit of Richard, Lydia & William Turgason (one each) infants of William Turgason of said county and Mary his wife late Turgason. Given under our hands this 25th day of Aug. 1837. Jas. Barlett, Jas. Thomas Everett Secs. Jas. Magel Sec. & Myrick Secs. (Whereupon, by consent of parties, it is agreed and ordered that the sale and division aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made, be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.
