An appeal from
a judgment of a

Justice of the Peace, recovered by the appellee against the appellant on the 10th day of June 1837, for one dollar and seventy eight cents costs.

This day came the parties by their attorneys who being fully heard, and sundry witnesses being sworn and examined, it seems to the Court that there is no error in the said judgment. Therefore it is considered that the same be affirmed and that the appellee recover against the appellant and Joseph Drury his security, upon said appeal the cost expended in defending this appeal as well as the cost expended in his defence before the single justice expended.

On the complaint of Charles Stedley an apprentice to Matthew Mills against the said Matthew Mills for immorality, corrections and insufficient allowance of raiment and food - it is ordered that the said Matthew Mills be summoned to the next Court to hear this complaint, and that said apprentice be committed to the custody of the overseers of the poor of this County to be provided for according to Law until the further order of the Court.

Ordered that the Sheriff purchase two stores for the Court house of this County, and cause them to be erected therein and present this account to the Court.

Ordered that the account of John R. Williams amounting to \$9.48 be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
