This day came the parties by their counsel and the Commissioners appointed to act under an Interlocutory Decree pronounced in this cause at the June Court 1833 made their report, which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: "We the undersigned the County Court of Southampton Co. do hereby certify to a record of the County Court of Southampton County at May Term 1833 and amended order at October Term 1835. The undersigned Commissioners appointed by said Court personally attended with the County Surveyor and proceeded to divide the lands belonging to the estate of David Newsum and respectfully submit the following report, accompanied by a plat of the lands made by the Surveyor. We have allotted to the widow Martha Newsum so her dower the plantation on which David Newsum died formerly by her and on which the said Martha Newsum now resides containing two hundred and forty acres & 30 poles together with a portion of the tract commonly called the Church tract containing one hundred and twenty one acres from the northern extremity of said tract divided by a line commencing at a black gum tree in the branch of the Delaplace Road and running S. 65° N. across a flat Swamp. The Widow Martha Newsum having executed a written release to the other parties of her interest in the lands of Virginia Newsum. The Commissioners have divided all the lands into three equal parts and allotted them as follows. To David Newsum the tract commonly called the Brown tract or the old Quarter with the exception of a portion cut off and added to the Harrison tract by a line commencing at a red oak tree in Smiths line and running in a south east course to a Post oak tree in the old line dividing the Harrison tract from the old quarter containing three hundred and eighty acres. To Rebecca Newsum the tract commonly called the Harrison tract with the exception of the portion cut off as above containing three hundred and forty six acres. To John A. Person for life with reversion to his son Junius Randolph the tract containing that portion of the Church tract not included in the dower, containing one hundred and thirty five acres one rood and thirty four poles, with the reversion in all the dower lands all of which is respectfully submitted. Given under our hands this 24th July, 1837. Henry Moore, James Jackson, Ro. J. Nugent" Whereupon it is decreed and ordered that the division aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.

Ordered That the unadministered estate of William Boyar's decd. do be committed to the hands of Benjamin Griffin Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

Ans Inventory and appraisement of the estate of Martha Williams decd. was returned and ordered to be recorded.
