This cause came on this day to be heard on the bill, answer and exhibit by consent of parties and was argued by Counsel. Whereupon the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Joseph I. Glauco, Samuel L. Brown, Nathaniel Francis and William James be appointed commissioners, any two of whom may act, who are hereby authorized and required to sell the tract of land referred to in the Complainant's bill, of which the said Edwin Harris died intestate, at public auction after due notice of the time and place of sale upon a credit of twelve months, except so much as may be necessary to defray the costs and charges of carrying this decree into execution, for which cash shall be required, taking from the purchaser or purchasers fair bonds with good and sufficient security of equal amounts for the purchase money, one of which they shall deliver to Edwin Harris, one to Charlotte Musgrave, one to Mary Elizabeth Persons and one to John Harris, and that they make report to this Court of their proceedings in order to a final decree.

Ordered that the estate of John Porter deceased be committed to the hands of Benjamin Griffin Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

On motion it is ordered that the estate of Richard Barrow deceased be committed to the hands of Benjamin Griffin Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

James W. Gardner of the County of Southampton laborer who stands charged with feloniously and maliciously stabbing and cutting Mary Gardner at the County of Southampton aforesaid with intention in so doing to maim, disfigure, disable or kill her the said Mary Gardner on the 11th day of September 1867 was put to the bar in custody of the Jailor (the Court demanding for his examination having failed to meet) and thereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and the prisoner fully heard by Counsel. On consideration whereof it is the opinion of the Court that the said James W. Gardner ought to be tried for the said offence at the next Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery to be held for this County. And thereupon the prisoner is remanded to Jail.

And it remembered that Mary Gardner, William Ellis and Martha Ellis here in Court solemnly acknowledged themselves to be indebted to David Campbell Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia and his successors an Officer in the sum of One hundred dollars each, of their respective lands and tenements, goods and chattels to be levied, and to the said Governor and his successors in Office for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. And upon this condition that if the said Mary Gardner William Ellis and Martha Ellis shall make their personal appearance before the Judge of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for Southampton County on the
