On the motion of the plaintiffs by Counsel John A Person is assigned guardian ad litem to the infant defendant Mary Elizabeth Parsons to defend her in this suit and thereupon this cause came on this day to be heard by consent of parties, on the bill, answers and exhibits, and was argued by Counsel, on consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, order and decree, that Joseph T. Eland, Nathaniel Francis, William A Jones, Edwin Eland and Samuel Drewry who are hereby appointed Commissioners for that purpose, any two of whom may act in carrying of this decree into effect, assign to Elizabeth Harris, one third of the slaves belonging to the estate of Samuel Harris deceased, to be held during her natural life, and that they divide the remaining slaves belonging to the said estate into four equal parts, allotting one to Edwin Harris one to Charlotte Musgrave one to Samuel Harris to be delivered and held by his guardian and one to Mary Elizabeth Person, to be delivered to and held by her guardian. And that the said Commissioners make report of their proceedings to this Court in order to a final decree -

Narcissa Stansum and Elizabeth Turner an infant under the age of twenty one years by Narcissa Stansum her mother and next friend

against Joseph T. Eland administrator of Robert T. Musgrave dec. and Peter Edwards administrator of James Turner dec.

In Chancery

This cause came on this day by consent of parties, to be heard on the bill, the answers of the defendants, and was argued by Counsel, on consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree, that Joseph T. Eland, as administrator of Robert T. Musgrave deceased settle before Jeremiah Cobb Commissioner, who is directed to state, audit and settle the same, an account of his intestates transactions as guardian of James and Elizabeth Turner and report the same to this Court in order to a further decree; and that Samuel Drewry, William A Jones, Nathaniel Francis and John A Person who are appointed Commissioners to carry this decree into effect, any two of whom may act, divide the slaves of Elizabeth and James Turner deceased into two equal parts and that they allot one moiety and the half of the other moiety to Elizabeth Turner and deliver them to her guardian, and the other half to the defendant Narcissa Stansum; and that they make report of their proceedings to this Court in order to a final decree -
