This day this cause came on again to be heard in its amended form, with papers formerly read and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order and decree that James D. Muspenburg, and Alexander Hynde be appointed Commis- sioners of this Court, that they sell to the highest bidder, after advertising the time and place of sale for twenty days, upon a credit of six months, the lands whereof Rebecca Beale died seized also the negro man Anthony, and take of the purchaser or purchasers, four bonds and assign one thereof to Simon Marfee in right of his wife, one to Jesse Foggerson in right of his wife one to John E Beale and James Barnes in right of his wife or sever the said bond so as to allot one half of one fourth, it being one eighth part of the whole to each of them, and assign the fourth bond of one fourth to the guardian at law to the infant children of Mary Marfee; and report their proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree -

On the motion of Henry Cornett who made oath and together with James Clayton his security entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of three hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Jesse Cornett deceased in due form.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine state and settle an account of Ann Nicholsons guardianship of Louisa, William and Joseph Nicholsons and make separate reports thereof to Court.

On the motion of James W Parker who made oath and together with Henry B Clapham and John G Massey his securities entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of six thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Temperance Parker deceased with her will thereto fore proved and recorded in this Court, annexed in due form -
