



Harrison More who is appointed constable in this County, this day, took the several oaths required by law, and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Three thousand dollars, with Elizabeth Darrin and Edwin Harrison, his securities, conditioned as the law directs. which bond was acknowledged by said obligor, and ordered to be recorded.

In the petition of Patrick Dole for leave to alter the road from the deacon's road near his house to the Tucker's Swamp meeting house. The Commissioner to whom said application was referred, made his report, which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: "Agreeably to an order of Court bearing date the 18th day of October last (passed in one of the Commissioners of Roads, proceeded to examine a route for a Road upon the application of Patrick Dole, to be from the deacon's road near his house to the Tucker's Swamp Meeting house, and am of opinion that such a Road would be attended with convenience to but few, individuals, to wit, Mrs. Sitas Summersell, P. Dole & Joseph & Leonard: There are two other public ways tending to the same point (Tucker's Swamp Meeting house) neither of which exceeds, agreeable to the information I could gain, six or at most seven miles, and both good ways, the road selected would be 2 1/2 miles in length, and generally a low wet, boggy, which would require ditching at least 1/2 of a mile, and calisevering in tubs or other places, making a distance of something like three hundred yards, exclusive of two pole bridges about twenty yards in length (the two) which together with the clearing and shrubbing, would, it is supposed cost from \$200 to \$350. The persons through whose land the road would run, so far as I could learn are disposed to give it clear of any charge. Respectfully Submitted Wm. D. Hood Comr. July 19, 1835." And it is ordered that the Sheriff summon the acting Justices of the peace for this County to the first day of the next term to consider the propriety of giving the said Dole leave to alter the said road as proposed.

This day came the parties by their counsels and the Commissioners appointed to act under an interlocutory pronounced in this cause at the February Term 1836 made their report, which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows: "Pursuant to a decree of the Court of the County of Southampton, February Term 1836 a copy of which is hereto annexed, we the undersigned Commissioners named therein have on the 10th day of March 1836 sold the lands therein described and William Joyner & Henry Blow, both of the County of Southampton became the purchasers thereof for the sum of Two hundred & twelve dollars and 75 cents and for which amount we have taken their bonds with approved security, which amount as soon as collected, after retaining the expenses incurred in the premises we shall deliver by said decree we were directed: which proceedings of ours we respectfully submit to the Court, Given under our hands this 15. day of July 1836. John Colwell Comr. to Turner Comr. Benjamin Bernal Comr." Whereupon, by consent of parties, it is decreed and ordered that the sale for said manner & form as aforesaid made be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.

Ordered that the account of William Atkinson amounting to thirty three cents and the account of James McNeill, jailed amounting to \$26.75 1/2 be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment.
