This day came the parties by their counsel and the Commissioner appointed to act under an interlocutory decree pronounced in this cause at the January Term 1836, made his Report, which is ordered to be received, and is as follows: "By virtue of a Decree of the County Court of Southampton dated January the 18th 1836, I James D. Bryant, special Commissioner, according to the said decree, advertised the negroes belonging to the estate of Thomas Bryant, and after giving twenty or more days public notice, sold the same for cash, retained the proceeds of such sale after deducting money to defray the expenses thereof, until the said Thomas Bryant's debts were considered paid; then divided the moneys arising from said sale after paying all expenses incurred by sale & decided among the heirs and Legatees of said Thomas in the following manner as stated below February 10. 1836. An account the sale of Negroes belonging to the Estate of Thomas Bryant, and sold under a decree of the County Court of Southampton by James D. Bryant, as Special Commissioner for such to the highest bidder—
