This day again appeared in Court in discharge of his Recognizance, and thereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined, and the prisoner fully heard by Counsel: On consideration whereof, it is the opinion of the Court, and accordingly ordered that the said Drewry Bittle be discharged from further prosecution for the said offence.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine state and settle an account of John M. Burley's administration on the estate of Lucy Quincy and make report thereof to this Court with any matters specially stated according to tenor by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the petition of John Hargrave & Thomas B. Morrell setting forth that they stand bound in this Court with Jacob Jordan for his due and faithful administration of the estate of Richard Jordan decd. and that the co-plaintiffs themselves in danger of suffering thereby, and praying the Court for relief, it is ordered that the said Jacob Jordan be summoned to the next Court to shew cause if any he have why he should not be ruled to give to the said Hargrave & Morrell good counter security.
