This day came the parties by their counsel and the commissioners appointed to act under an Intervenor- tor, decree pronounced in this cause at December term 1837. made their report which is ordered to be recorded, and is as follows " Pursuant to the annexed order from the worshipful Court of Southampton bearing date 10th March 1837, with the undersigned, acting as commissioners under the said decree, after giving due notice of the time and place, proceeded on the 16th day, Decr. 1837, to make sale of the lands required by the said decree, to which Peter L. Beakman became the purchaser at the sum of one thousand two hundred & fifteen dollars - deducting thirty two dollars and thirty two cents as necessary expenses for carrying the said order into effect leaving a balance due of one thousand one hundred and eighty two dollars and thirty six cents, which amount we have taken from the said Beakman with The Ridley Senr. & wife, four bonds on demand the 14th day December 1838 of equal amount (say two hundred & thirty five dollars sixty seven cents) and one of which we have delivered to Edwin Harris - one to Charlotte Musgrave - the two remaining bonds your Honors directed to be delivered to Sturges Harris and Mary Elizabeth Person - knowing the said Sturges Harris and Mary E. Person to be infants and believing it to be the intention of the court to have ordered the said bonds to be delivered to the Guardians, we have delivered one to Peter Edwards Guardian to Sturges Harris and one to John A Person Guardian to Mary E. Person - All which is respectfully submitted given under our hands this 20th day of March 1838.
