

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the opening of a new road to run from the Jerusalem road near Silas Hicks to the Brown road and entering it near Tarkenton W. Scotts this day made their report which is Ordered to be recorded, and is in these words to wit "We the undersigned Commissioners proceeded according to the within order to let the road therein mentioned to the lowest undertaker. The road was let in two sections, the first of which was undertaken by Ely Snyder at the price of thirty two dollars, and the second section by Benjamin Barnes at the price of twenty seven dollars & 100. The work having been completed according to contract we have received the same as a public road and submit these proceedings to the County Court Jordan Edwards, Benj. Denny." And upon consideration of the report the Court doth receive and establish the said road as a public highway.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
