Joseph Senow of the County of Fayette and State of Tennessee who stands charged with maliciously, wilfully unlawfully and feloniously slaying with a dirk or some such unlawful weapon, Samuel Pond in sundry parts of the body &c of Samuel Pond of the County of Southampton with intention to maim, disfigure, disable or kill the said Samuel M. Pond at a place in the County of Southampton called Porters on the 29th day of June last, passed, appeared in court in discharge of his Recognizance entered into before Jeremiah Robt Esq. a Justice of the Peace for this County, and was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County (the Court summoned for his examination having failed to meet). And thereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined, and the prisoner by his Counsel fully heard. On consideration whereof it is the opinion of the Court from all the circumstances that the prisoner ought to be tried for the said offence at the next Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery to be held for this County. And on the motion of the prisoner he is allowed to give bail, himself to be bound in a recognizance in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars, with two securities in the sum of seven hundred & fifty dollars each. Thereupon the said Joseph Senow together with Jacob Senow and Joseph S. Holland his securities, here in Court severally acknowledged themselves to be indebted to Daniel Campbell Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, that is to say the said Joseph Senow in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars and the said Jacob Senow and Joseph S. Holland in the sum of seven hundred & fifty dollars each, to be levied of their respective goods & chattels lands & tenements, and to the said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth &c. And upon this condition that if the said Joseph Senow shall make his personal appearance before the Judge of the Circuit Superior Court of Law & Chancery for this County on the first day of the next term of the said Court, by twelve o'clock in the morning of that day to stand his trial for the felony aforesaid of which he stands charged &c to answer the indictment which may be preferred against him and shall not depart thence without leave of the said Court, then the above recognizances to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
