McComb Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

Ordered that Augustus Pope, Meta Pope, John Barkham and Henry Winchell or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of James Morrell Sr. dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

To Elizabeth Harris in dower we have allotted Fanny, Lytha, William, Edy, Nancy & child Figgins, Ellick, Peggy, Bill, Aaron, Ellick, Frank, Solomon, Sam, Bob, John, Peter Gary, & Fanny valued at Four thousand nine hundred & fifty six dollars, it being the third part of the slaves of s^r dec^d. The remaining two thirds, we have allotted in the following manner. To Charlotte Musgrave, Bob, Sarah, old Ben, Violet & child Tom, Mary, Milly, & Austin & Pleasant, valued to three thousand & seventy five dollars, by her paying to Stuart Harris's lot of \$38. also to John A. Person dower of \$45. also to Edwin Harris of \$3.00. To Edwin Harris, Mary, Stephen, Sam, Harriet & child Dennis, Jane, Martha, Susan, Charles,

and old Sam valued at \$29 Hardy, Nelson, Aggy, & child To Mrs. A. Person dower. child Dory valued to \$29.30. Child, J. S. Child, & child parties it is decreed and ordered as aforesaid made be held firm.
