This cause came on this day to be again heard upon the papers formerly read the report of
Litherton B. Edwards Commissioner made under the order of the day of October 1857. to which
no exception has been filed, and was argued by himself. On consideration whereof the Court conforming
the said report, doth adjudge, order and decree that the defendant Carr Jones administrator
and Committee of the estate of Sally Everett deceased out of his own goods and chattels pay to
the Plaintiff Joseph Rogers eighty three dollars and thirty three cents with interest on sixty five
dollars and thirty eight cents part thereof from the 29th day of September 1855 till paid.
To Peter Fairclough Two hundred and thirty dollars forty nine cents with interest on one hundred
and twenty seven dollars twenty eight cents part thereof from the 29th day of September 1858 till paid.
To Elizabeth D. Barkham, Ninety dollars and forty two cents with interest on ten dollars and ninety
three cents part thereof from the 29th day of September 1858 till paid. and that the costs of
this suit be paid by the defendant out of his own goods and chattels. But the Plaintiff is
not to have the benefit of this decree until each of them shall have given bond with good
security to the said Carr Jones administrator of Sally Everett in a penalty equal to
the amount he may receive Conditioned to respond due proportions of any debts or demands which
may hereafter arise against the estate together with the costs attending the same.

Nathaniel Simmons foreman, Thomas Pethman, Leonard Kelt, John D. Clark, River Barker,
William J. Williams, Carlton W. Scott, Nathaniel Turner, Melborne Stephenson, Bennett J. Griff-
in, Joseph R. Dancy, Richard H. Brown, Richard H. Leonard, Jesse Hollings, Thomas H. Brown,
Ethelred Warren, Orman M. Bryant, William Prince, Joel Prince, John C. Beale,
John Wilson, William Holt, Edwin Harris and Gilbert Beck, were sworn a grand jury of
inquest upon the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after some-
time returned into Court and having nothing to present were discharged.

Upon the application of David Bryant for leave to erect a water grist mill on his lands on
the north side of the upper part of the swamp between the mills of Rockelle and Allen at an old
mill seat in this County; and Robert Williams the owner of the lands on the opposite of the said
swamp here in Court acknowledged due notice of this application of the said David Bryant.
Whereupon it is ordered that a writ of ad quod damnum be awarded the said David
Bryant according to law to be executed on the 10th day of December next. Which writ together
with the inquest taken in pursuance thereof is to be returned to the next Court.
