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This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioner appointed by the interceding done made in this cause at Harmer Term last to make sale of the Slaves therein mentioned this day made the following report to the Court. In conformity to the annexed decree, the undersigned did on the 11th day of December 1838 sell to the highest bidder on a credit of six months except so much as will pay the charges of the decree, and \$100. in cash two negroes belonging to the heirs of Isaac Rowe dec^d, namely Summa and her Child Dennis, and Doctor Robert Murray became the purchaser for the sum of \$755.00, from this sum I have taken \$12.32 cents lawyers & clerks fees, 2 1/2 per Cent Commissions which is \$18.87 1/2 cents Commissioner's fee and \$100 in cash, leaving the sum of \$622.81 1/2 cents the credit part, which I have divided into seven equal parts, making the sum of \$89.10 1/2 cents each child's part for which amount I have taken bonds with sufficient security, one payable to William Rowe, one to Sally Rowe, one other to John Rowe, one other to Edwin Rowe, one other to Mary Rowe, one other to Harvey Rowe, and one other to Robert Rowe, and the \$100, which I received in cash I have divided into seven equal parts making \$14.28 1/2 cents each, and paid the same over to the parties or their guardians as by the decree I am required. Given under my hand this 11th day of December 1838. Wm. Griffin Commissioner. On consideration whereof and by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the sale and division aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made be held firm stable and binding forever between the parties.

Ordered that Alexander Briggs, David Prince, Green Adams and John Y Mason or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Mary W Lewis dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion of Patrick Dotes who is the security of Elizabeth Boykin for her guardianship of Thomas D and Elizabeth S Boykin orphans of David S Boykin dec^d. It is ordered that the said Elizabeth Boykin be summoned to the next Court to show cause if any she can why she should not be ruled to give the said Patrick Dotes good Counter Security.

On the motion of Augustin Pope who made oath and together with John Hargrave and James Morrell his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Stuart Holt deceased in due form.

Ordered that Selah Ellsworth, Weston Pope and Henry Joyner being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Stuart Holt dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
