And that the said Joel Edwards be committed to the custody of the Sheriff of the said County, until he shall enter into a recognizance with sufficient security in the sum of One hundred and forty dollars conditioned to pay the same. And the said Joel Edwards being unable to give the said security and desirous to avail himself of the privileges of an insolvent debtor, here in Court subscribed and delivered in a schedule of his estate and made oath thereto as the law directs. Whereupon it is ordered that he be discharged from custody if detained for no other cause.

§5.26 Sampson Reese having obtained an attachment against the estate of Peter J. J. an absconding debtor for thirty dollars and twenty five cents with interest from the 25th day of December 1837 due by note. And the Constable having made return that he had "attached Two old Cows and three heifers." This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant being solemnly called and not appearing to reply the same, it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recovers against the defendant the said sum of thirty dollars and twenty five cents with interest thereon from the 25th day of December 1837 till his debt is paid or he is just and his costs by him in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that the Constable make sale of the property aforesaid by him attached, as the law directs, and out of the moneys arising from such sale pay and satisfy this judgment to the plaintiff, and return the surplus, if any, to the defendant and return an account of such sale to the Court.

On the motion of Fielding J. Mahone who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law and together with John C. Swinner his security entered into and acknowledged a bond for the penalty of One hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs, a license is granted him to keep an Ordinary at Crockettville in this County till the next May Term of this Court. The Court being satisfied that he is a man of good Character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

On the motion of John Hargrave for leave to open a new road on the line between himself and Christian Jordan. It is ordered that Jacob Barnes, Benjamin Dunn, William H. Cutler and Mannus Maget or any three of them, being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do view the ground along which said road is proposed to be conducted and report to the Court the conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public if such road be opened as is proposed.

The copy of the register of Solomon Hicks free negro, was examined and Certified to be truly made.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine, State and settle an account of Dandan M. Bryant's guardianship of Nathan Williams and report the same to the Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.
