On the motion of Joseph A. Barham for leave to alter the road near his house. It is ordered that William Jenkins, George B. Cary and Robert Ridley being first duly sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose devalue the ground along which said road is proposed to be conducted as well as the present way and report to the Court the comparative conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public if such alteration be made as is proposed. Whereupon the said viewers immediately made their report which is ordered to be recorded, and is in these words to-wit: "Southampton County - To the worshipful Court of Southampton We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by the Court of said County to view the propriety and impropriety, conveniences and inconveniences, advantages and disadvantages that will result as well to individuals as to the public by the contemplated change of the road described in the order of the Court have performed the duty imposed upon us and are of opinion that no public inconvenience will result from such removal or alteration. William Jenkins, George B. Cary, R. Ridley: And upon consideration thereof and all the circumstances of the case it is the opinion of the Court that leave be given the said Barham to alter the said road as proposed, and when the same be opened and put in good repair that the old road be discontinued and the new road be established as a public highway.

On the motion of James D. Maysburg, Curator of the orphans of Ichabod Johnson dec. It is ordered that the said Curator be authorized to expend one hundred dollars of the principal of the sons estate and thirty dollars each of the principal of the two girls estate for their support and education.

Ordered that the hands of Samuel J. James be added to work on the roads whereof Samuel B. Hines is Surveyor.

William M. Cutler is appointed Surveyor of the road from the Cypress Swamp to Dick's Swamp in the name of John C. Turner excused and that the usual hands do work thereon.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the Court in course
