This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed by the interlocutory decree made in this cause at January Court last to make sale of the land therein mentioned made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words to wit "James I Darden vs. Richard I Darden. In obedience to an interlocutory decree of the Court pronounced the 21st day of January 1839 by the County Court of Southampton. Your Commissioners having advertised the time and place of sale of the lands in the bill mentioned whereof Wm Darden died seized known as the Stark Tract, proceeded on Thursday the 7th day of February 1839 and sold the same to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months, except so much as was necessary to pay the costs of the suit where Benj^a Britt became the last bidder and purchaser of the said Tract or parcel of land for the sum of \$270.25

Your Commissioners then deducted 5% Cent Commission on the sales, amounting to \$13.51 and \$12.32 the other of clerks fees, making the sum of leaving a balance of

Your Commissioners then executed deed with out warranty to Benj^a Britt the purchaser aforesaid. All which is respectfully submitted. Given under our hands the 7th day of February 1839. Jesse Parker. Elisha Darden."
