The last will and Testament of Lewis A Branch deceased was proved by the oath of James H H Pond, Simeon Watkins and Benjamin Lamer the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded - and the executor therein named refused to qualify as such. On the motion of John A Booth who made oath and together with James H H Pond, Simeon Watkins, Benjamin A H Connerick, John A Hill, Marmaduke H Branch and Samuel H Pond has decreed entered into and obtained a bond in the penalty of Twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted here for issuing letters of administration on the estate of the said Lewis A Branch dec^d with his will referred annexed on due form.

Nathaniel Townsend, foreman, Henry Woodard, Nathaniel Jones, Benjamin C Walker, Sarah Marshall, John Hoop, Samuel W Woodard, Jesse J Post, John Jory, John W Reese, Thomas W Correll, Marmaduke H Branch, Allen Stephenson, Henry Rauls, Thomas M Bailey, A B Williams, Henry Woodard, Jesse Rellings, James H Branch, Gray Edwards, Jonathan W Cook, Anthony W Correll & John Davis were sworn a grand jury of and just upon the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and presented as follows to wit

The present Samuel S Dayton for a salt and battery with a stick on James I Poston on the public highway in the County of Southampton on the 9th of June 1839 by the information of Joseph C Counsel sworn in Court and sent to the grand jury to give evidence.

The present Thomas S Prother and Francis E Rives for and affray by fighting together in public on or about the 20th May 1839 at the late residence of Lewis A Branch in the County of Southampton by the information of James Clayton sworn in Court and sent to the grand jury to give evidence.

The present Robert Kelly and William S Debell for and affray by fighting together in public at Lewis Tavern in the Town of Jerusalem in Southampton County on the day after May Court last by the information of James Muggitt and Sampson C Reese sworn in Court and sent to the grand jury to give evidence.

The present Edwin B Wood for assault on William S Corroth on or about the first day of April last at James J Jones in the County of Southampton by the information of William M Corroth called on and sworn in Court to give evidence by the jury - And the grand jury hearing nothing further to present was discharged.

Ordered that proper process be issued against the persons presented by the grand jury returnable here at August Court next.

William B Wood presented a Commission from the Governor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 27th day of December 1838 appointing him Sheriff of this County to continue in Office for the term of three years: and thereupon the said William B Wood took
