

On the motion of James D. Hoptung Curator of Selmer Seaman School, Hampton
Jordaw, Ellen Elizabeth and Selmer operators of School Selmer etc.
Ordered that Master Commissioned Coltr examine State and settle an account of the
said Hoptung's Curatorship and report the same to Court with any matters specially stated
demanded by himself or which he may be required to state -

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs or rebuilding of the
bridge over the three creeks near Selor & Wickmans this day made their report which is ordered
to be recorded and is in these words to wit: "We the Commissioners appointed by Southampton
County Court after examining the three creek bridge called Long bridge and finding such
repairs required as we thought necessary let the said bridge to the lowest undertaker, which
Nestor Brew became the undertaker at one hundred and eighty four dollars and two
dollars p hundred for the timber for all extra work, and has completed the said job ac-
cording to contract which we Commissioners do report to Court according to said order made
by the Court of Southampton - June 8/1809 assigned by Joseph H. ^{the} Parham, Thomas
Ridley & -

This day John M. Kealey produced an account of his services as a Commissioner of
the Revenue, and the Court have considered that twenty five days were requisite for the
said Commissioner to perform the services aforesaid.

James M. Cloud who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here this day to
answer the complaint of Wiley Joyner against him for a breach of the peace appointed in
discharge of the said recognizance. And therefore the said Wiley Joyner and deputy
sheriff were sworn and examined and the said Cloud fully heard. The Court after
hearing the evidence is of opinion and do accordingly order that the said James M. Cloud
give security for his keeping the peace for the term of twelve months from this day, the
said Cloud to be bound in the sum of One hundred dollars with two securities in
the sum of fifty dollars each. Whereupon the said James M. Cloud together with
Dewey Wattle and Thomas W. Deale his securities here in Court acknowledged themselves
indebted to David Damsell Esq. Receiver of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the said
Cloud in the sum of One hundred dollars and the said Wattle and Deale in
the sum of fifty dollars each to be made and levied of their respective lands and tenements
goods and Chattels and to the said Receiver and his successors for the use of the
Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said James M. Cloud
shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of this
Commonwealth more especially towards Wiley Joyner aforesaid for the term of twelve
months from this day then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full
force and virtue.

An Account of Rebecca Stephens guardianship of Mary Mathews and Richard
Stephens was returned and ordered to be recorded.
