

The Court doth assign Allow Edwards guardian to Susannah, Elizabeth A Davis
and Matthew Joyner orphans of Matthew Joyner deceased who together with James
W Mowry and James Clayton his dependents entered into and acknowledged a bond in
the penalty of fifteen thousand dollars conditioned according to Law.

Ordered that Herbert Lawer, Joseph L Bailey, Henry Both and Thomas D rumright
or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose
do appraise all the personal and real estate of Lewis A Branch which he above may be
produced or shown and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

The Court certifies that it appears to them from the evidence of William W Cutler
a respectable witness that Lewis Story who is reported to have been a Soldier in the
Revolution died in this County intestate on the 26th day of April 1839 leaving a
widow named Nelly Story.

James Ross who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the complaint
of Wiley Joyner against him for a breach of the peace this day appeared according to the same
thereupon the said Wiley Joyner and sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and the
said James Ross fully heard. On consideration whereof it seems to the Court here
is accordingly ordered that the said complaint be dismissed and that the said Wiley
Joyner pay the costs of the prosecution.
