

Resolved that these proceedings be spread upon the records of this Court and that a copy be forwarded by the clerk to the widow of the deceased and another copy be inserted in the Richmond and Petersburg gazettes.

Ordered that Henry Pittman, Joseph Blanton and Richard Thomas or any two of them do let to the Court and shew the repairs of the bridge across the Mill race of Mr. Hannah M. Richards, the bridge below Edw. George Ward mill and also another bridge near the one last named, receive the same when completed and make report thereof to Court.

At Mr. Seibell and Samuel P. Nicholson two of the Justices of the Peace for this County this

On the motion of Adams Ford who made oath and together with William M. Scott and John D. Williams his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of forty dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Deborah Bryant dec'd in due form.

Ordered that William M. Scott, John D. Williams and John Cobb being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Deborah Bryant dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Mary Freeman widow of Charles Freeman deceased relinquished her right to the administration of her deceased husband's estate in favour of Samuel H. Holmes. And on the motion of the said Samuel H. Holmes who made oath and together with John P. Watling and James Clayton his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Charles Freeman dec'd in due form.

Ordered that John P. Watling, Phineas M. Bailey and John P. Watling being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Charles Freeman dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
