Ordered that the Sheriff collect from each taxable person in this County the sum of Sixty cents, therewith pay and discharge the foregoing allowances to the persons to whom they are respectively due, and the balance of any return in his hands subject to the future orders of the Court.

Sundry list of Sackett County Lewis amounting to \$238.10 cents were presented down to and allowed.

It appears to the Court from satisfactory evidence that Lewis Hogg was a prisoner of the United States at the rate of eight dollars per month, was a resident of this County and died there on the 26th day of April 1839 and that his wife a widow whose name is Melly Hogg

On the motion of Fielding J Mahend who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by Law and together with John M. Bailey his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One hundred and fifty dollars in the law docket a license is granted him to keep an Ordinary at Crookstonville in this County till May Court next. It appearing to the Court that he is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

It appearing to the Court that a bridge has been established over Black Water river which is a navigable stream, with which bridge there is connected a draw-arch for the admission of Vessels and other boats in their navigation of the said river, and it further appearing that the Steamboat Fox daily passes through the said bridge and that John J. Middlebrod the Captain of the said Steamboat, is compelled to pay the sum of seventy five dollars to have the said draw-arch opened and closed, and a motion having been made to the said Court by the said John J. Middlebrod to levy upon the people of the County of Southampton a tax to pay, in consequence with the County of Hancock. The proposition of the said County five dollars or if such sum as the Court may think sufficient for the purpose, with the view of having the said arch regularly opened for the passage of the said Steamboat during the ensuing year. It is ordered by the said Court that the said application be rejected on the ground that this Court is under no obligation therefore. Messrs. Manning J. Smith and Richard A. Woodworth two of the members of the Court voted in favour of making the appropriation and desired that it be recorded.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Webb examine Deeds and Sells and account of Matthew R. Pope administrator of William Williams estate and report the same to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.
