The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the middle bridge near Jerusalem this day made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words to wit: "We the Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton June Term 1809 to let out to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the little bridge South side of Molliney Run & near Jerusalem do make the following report. On the 29<sup>th</sup> of the same month the said bridge was let out to the lowest undertaker of Soper St Barnard become the sum of thirty four dollars, we have since examined the bridge and find the work faithfully done agreeable to contract. Theodore Bryant, A. N. Cobell. July 1809."

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs or rebuilding of their bridge this day made report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words to wit: "Pursuant to an order from the Worshipful Court of Southampton County bearing date October Court 1808 to us directed, we the undersigned Commissioners after giving due notice of the time and place let to the lowest undertaker the rebuilding of Shorebridge across the three creeks as expressed in said order for which work Sam'l Drury became contractor for the sum of five hundred dollars and has since been completed according to contract. Given under our hands this 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1809. Jas. D. Barnard

Mongeon this day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant hath had legal notice of this suit in which he was personally called but came not. Therefore it is ordered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the sum of fifty ten dollars and twelve cents with interest thereon from the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September 1808 till paid that being the amount paid by the plaintiff as the defendant's security upon four several executions issued out by Thos. E. Parker and others and also that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the sum he hath in this behalf expended. And the said defendant in Mercy.
