

that they attended by a competent Surveyor, all to Mrs. Crumpler late widow of Stuart Edwards one third of the lands (regard being had to value) whereof Stuart Edwards died seized for life, and that they sell to the highest bidder on a credit of six months the other two thirds together with the fee simple interest in the third which is to be allotted as above directed: and after receiving money enough in cash to pay the costs of this decree, takes of the purchaser seven bonds of equal amounts, and assigns one to Tyler Edwards, one right of his wife, one to Gray Edwards, one to Collins Barnes guardian of child of Randolph Edwards, one to Anthony Vaughan, in right of his wife, one to John Morse in right of his wife, one to William Edwards and the other to Eliza Dandridge in right of his wife - And report their proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree -

The Court doth assign William H. Webb guardian to Eliza Jane Murrey and Catharine Bryant nephews of Jonathan Bryant dec'd and thenceforth the said William H. Webb together with John D. Williams Lemuel Roberts and John Cobb his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars with condition according to Law.

An account of John R. Chambliss' guardianship of Rebecca Murrey was returned and ordered to be recorded.

James Peck having obtained an attachment against the estate of Gray Edwards who has removed or absconded out of the County privately, for the sum of One hundred & eighty dollars with interest thereon from the 18 day of February 1836 due by note, also the sum of Sixteen dollars 50/100 due by note bearing date 13th October 1836 with interest thereon, and the Sheriff having made return that he had executed the said attachment on one bond executed by Benjamin Vick for two hundred and twenty three dollars 25/100 bearing date the 19th day of June inst. Benjamin Vick's receipt for goods amounting to one hundred and four dollars 50/100 to be accounted for by said Vick - Four notes against Solomon Johnson amounting to forty eight dollars 50/100 - One account against Fielding Mahan for thirty seven dollars 50/100 - A small lot of dry goods, part of a barrel of sugar, part of a barrel of brandy, part of a chest of tea, some Candles, part of a keg of powder, some spurs, spigot, a few articles of ready made clothing - a cake of soap, a lot of paper, a few rods of madder, a table, several chairs, a chest, one clock, 2 pitchers, a lot of iron ware, a Serris Wagon, a two horse Wagon, a Cart and wheels, and one black steer, part of a keg of stouts, a brick and masonry - The above named Solomon Johnson, Benjamin Vick and Fielding Mahan have been summoned by writs the next County Court as garnishees. I have also garnished William Edwards, Allen Edwards and Abram Riddick by summoning them to the next Court to answer to the amount due from them to Gray Edwards. The foregoing attachment came to hand and was executed at Clover Creek June 22^d 1839. Whereupon for reasons appearing to the Court the said attachment is continued till the next Court -

Anthony Vaughan having obtained an attachment against the estate of Gray Edwards who hath privately absconded, for One hundred dollars due by note with interest thereon from the 18th day of May 1836, also forty dollars by note due the 6th day of October 1836
