

also for twenty five dollars due 11th July 1826 with interest thereon, also a note for fifteen dollars with interest thereon from the 1st January 1822, also a note for sixteen dollars due July 1826 with interest which note is entitled to a credit of \$9.52 per. And the Sheriff has made return that he had executed the said attachment on the articles enumerated in the return on James Scott's attachment and the same return that was given to Benjamin Vick, Solomon Johnson, and Falding Mahan as garnishees in that case was likewise given in this. Also William Edwards, Allen Edwards, and Abram Riedelich have in like manner been garnishees and summoned to Court to answer to the amount due from them to Gray Edwards. The writ of attachment came to hand and was executed at three o'clock June 22nd 1829. Whereupon for reasons appearing to the Court the said attachment is continued till the next Court.

James Williams having obtained an attachment against the estate of Gray Edwards who is removed out of the County privately so that the ordinary process of Law cannot be served upon him, for the sum of four dollars and fifty cents by note the 26th January 1827, by note four dollars fifty cents the 5th of April 1827, by note eight dollars & 50 cents the 8th day of April 1827, by an account of One hundred and thirteen dollars twenty eight cents with interest thereon from the dates of the said notes and account and the Constable having made the following return upon the said attachment. "A List of property attached in the hands of Matthew Drake the 26th day of June 1829. Seven fur hats, Seven dollars in Cash one draw knife, Cloth for pantaloons, at Mrs. Trottens. In July 1829 two feather beds and furniture, 60 barrels of Corn - 6th July. One horse & 19 head hogs. Given in - Enthal's Debt to Court. John Drake, of John Thomas Scott for, Matthew Drake, & H. L. Turner, William Edwards, Davy Scott for, William Drake, Huchson Bradshaw, and to be returned to Court. William Davis Co. July 15th 1829." For reasons appearing to Court the said attachment is continued till next Court. And ordered that Thomas Scott, Matthew Drake, Mills Turner, William Edwards, Davy Scott for, William Drake, Huchson Bradshaw, John Drake, of John Tarrant W. Scott, & Allen Edwards be taken as garnishees.

Setts D Williams having obtained an attachment against the estate of Gray Edwards who was removed out of the County privately and concealed himself so that the ordinary process of Law cannot be served upon him, for the sum of five hundred and sixty three dollars fifty six cents by bond bearing date December 25th 1828 pay able one day after date with a credit of One hundred and fifteen dollars paid March 7th 1829 - and the Constable has made the following return upon the said attachment. "By virtue of the within I have received the following property, which is in the hands of William Edwards Justice has two feather beds and furniture, three, about sixty barrels of Corn 18 head of hogs, and 6 pair of pantaloons which I have secured in my hands. June 22nd 1829. In five yards succession." And for reasons appearing to the Court the said attachment is continued till the next Court.

On the motion of John L. Turner and Blake Edwards setting forth that they are garnishees in this debt as debtors for William Scott for his transactions as dealer of slaves &c.
