

and twenty cents the penalty of the said bond and her costs by her about her suit in this behalf expended. And the said Defendants in Money &c.
But this execution may be discharged by the payment of thirty dollars and ten cents with legal interest thereon from the 15th day of July 1839 till paid and the costs.

Charles F. Mergant is appointed Surveyor of the road in the name of Jesse Little executed and it is ordered that the usual hands do work thereon.

Thomas Turner is appointed Surveyor of the road in the name of John Drury executed and it is ordered that the usual hands do work thereon.

On the motion of George Bay guardian to Benjamin Washington orphan of Benjamin Washington dec^d and for reasons appearing to the Court, The Court doth order that the said guardian take from the principal of the estate of the said orphan the sum of eighty dollars to be applied, in addition to the profits of the estate, to the education and support of said orphan the next year. It seeming to the Court that the profits of his estate are insufficient for the purpose.

A report of the division and allotment of the estate of Wiley Willms dec^d was this day returned and ordered to be recorded, and is in these words to wit. "Agreeable to the foregoing valuation of the property of Wiley Willms dec^d made by the undersigned (which was shown by the parties for that purpose) we have proceeded to allot to the widow Rhoda Willms a reasonable support for life agreeable to the Will of said dec^d and then have divided into three equal parts the remainder of the estate both real and personal, in the following manner. We have allotted to Joseph Gardner in right of his wife Patsy one third part. To Doctor A. S. St. Pierre in right of his wife Lucretia one third part and to Miss Lucy Willms the other one third part. We give the widow the house plantation containing 150 acres valued at \$1.00. She owns one half of the same in fee simple, with the privilege of getting cedar timber off of the Westward Willms plantation to supply the Northward part of the same. Also the following negroes Edmund valued at \$425. Henry at \$225. and Mary at \$100. together with chattel estate to the amount of about \$700. making nearly one third part of the estate which she is to retain for such during her natural life, all of which at her death is to be equally divided between the above named heirs. The other two thirds of the estate both real and personal we have divided in the following manner. The Westward Willms tract of land of 200 acres valued at \$400. the Philip Stinson tract of 150 acres valued at \$275, and the Bowden tract of 150 acres valued at \$200 making in the aggregate the sum of \$875. to be divided into three equal parts, making the sum of \$291 66 2/3 each parties share of the land. The valuation of the slaves to be divided between the children are as follows. Peggy valued at \$75 (infant) Moriah and child at \$450. Maria at \$600. Alfred at \$350. Robert at \$350. Henry at \$200. Van Doren at \$225. Annand at \$150. George at \$150. Cherry at \$100. Matthew at \$75. Mary at \$200. (the last named was advanced to Joseph Gardner) making in the aggregate the sum of \$2725 to be divided into three equal parts, making to each share \$908 33 1/3. In the slaves we now add the value of the land and slaves together and let them off into three equal parts.
