This disposition of this property or money is different from that ordered in the will for the sale of these negroes - The decree was incorrect in dividing this slave estate only among the living heirs when it should have been paid over as aforesaid into the hands of the heirs of those dead who would be entitled if living - It would be attended with still more expense to obtain another and new decree, and being I have settled this matter upon just and legal principles - James J French
On consideration whereof and by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that date and license of record in manner and form as aforesaid made to hold for and payable and forever binding between the parties -

On the motion of Nathaniel D. Land. Ordered that the account current of Robert Judkins' administration in Robert J. Beckhards estate be continued till the next term.

Ordered that Samuel B. Woodward and Peter Edwards be admitted to the bar and therefore appointed to appraise the estate of Thomas Evans deceased, and that any short of the appraisers make a report.
