

owner and proprietor of the plaintiff, that the said Carter Edmunds on the 29th October 1828 made his last Will and Testament which was admitted to record in the Probate and Quarter Sessions of the County of Northampton in the State of North Carolina and that the same was also recorded in the County Court of Southampton in the State of Virginia, and that the said Carter Edmunds died on or about the day of 1829, which last Will and Testament is in the following words and figures to wit.

In the name of God Amen. I Carter Edmunds being weak in body but in my sound and disposing mind, and knowing that all men are liable to die, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament - First I recommend my soul unto the hands of my merciful Creator and my body to be decently interred - as to my worldly estate I do will and bequeath it in the manner following to wit. Item 1st. From the plantation which my woman Hannah has rendered me, it is my will and desire that she and three children be set free. Item 2^d. I do will and bequeath to the said Hannah fifty acres of land the line commencing at the lower corner of my yard next to her running directly to a branch thence up the branch a sufficient distance that the side shall be parallel to the first line run. It is my desire a good framed house by sixteen feet to be built upon said land having two good floors a brick chimney three eight light windows, on such site as Hannah shall designate. I also do that she have a Garden cleared and fenced and a good well sunk in the yard at expence of my estate. Item 3^d. I give and bequeath to the above mentioned woman Hannah a negro woman Lucy and her increase to her and her heirs forever. Two cows, two sons and one year's provision of corn and pork in addition to the above legacies I give and bequeath to the said Hannah fifty dollars annually to be paid in State. Lastly I wish that Hannah and her three children Richard, Henry and Margaret shall remain where they are upon my plantation and their expenses to be out of my estate until my executor makes the provision I have provided for them. Item 4^d. I do give and bequeath to my brother Henry Edmunds three thousand dollars. Rebecca and Eliza Edmunds four thousand dollars to be equally divided between them provided that he who does not interfere with the settlement of this late legacy should either me or so. I exclude him or her from any interest in my estate or any part thereof to the other brother or sister or brother sisters as the case may be. Item 5^d. The residue of my estate of every kind and description whatever I do give to my brother Nicholas Edmunds to dispose of in such manner as may seem best to my wife which I give to my nephew Carter Edmunds. Item 6^d. To my nephews Miles and Harry the son of negro woman Lucy I wish the said brothers to go out to some trade and to reap the profits of their until they become twenty one years of age then to be set free should they be found tractable and well behaved descendants. Having will and desire should the laws of Virg. and North Carolina be law when my woman Hannah cannot remain in the jurisdiction of either Commonwealth to sell the land willed her, pay over to her the proceeds of the sale of the land and pay the amount remaining to such free state as she may choose to go out of my estate. Item 7^d. To my brother Nicholas Edmunds my sole Executor to close my last will and Testament. Test. The 3rd Oct. 1828. H. P. Edmunds - Estates and interests before dying. Deed of Hannah L.
