

where they are upon my plantation and their expenses be paid out of my estate until my executors make the provision I have provided for her. Item 4<sup>th</sup> I do give and bequeath to my deceased brother Henry & Edmunds three children Carter, Rebecca and Eliza Edmunds four thousand dollars to be equally divided between them provided that her she does not interfere with the settlement of their late fathers estate. Should either one do so I exclude him or her from any interest in my estate and do give his or her portion to the other brother or sister or his two sisters as the case may be. Item 5<sup>th</sup> The residue of my estate of every kind and description whatsoever bonds, money &c I give to my brother Nicholas Edmunds to dispose of in such manner as may see fit except my watch which I give to my nephew Carter Edmunds. Item 6<sup>th</sup> My two boys (nigro Miles and Henry) the sons of nigro woman Lucy I wish the said Nicholas Edmunds to bind out to some trade and to rear the profits of them until they become Twenty five years of age then to be set free should they be found tractable and well behaved servants. Item 7<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire should the laws of New and North Carolina be found such that the woman Hannah cannot remain in the jurisdiction of either Commonwealth that my executors sell the land which her pay over to her the proceeds of the sale of the land and pay the expenses of removing to such free State as she may choose to go out of my estate. Item 8<sup>th</sup> I leave my brother Nicholas Edmunds my sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament. C. Edmunds ~~Test~~

Ordered by the Court that the said Will with the Codicil be recorded. Whereupon Nicholas Edmunds the executor therein named qualified as the law directs.
