

Ordered that the Sheriff pay to Robert Drayton out of any contingent moneys in his hands the sum of seven dollars -

An Inventory and appraisement of Jacob Kells estate was returned and ordered to be recorded.

The last Will and Testament of William Halden deceased was proved by the oath of Richard A. Wigglesworth and John Jones two of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and having been before proved by the oath of Drury Ford also a subscribing witness thereto is ordered to be recorded, and on the petition of Henry Halden the executor therein named who made oath and together with Richard A. Wigglesworth his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form -

The last Will and Testament of James Taylor deceased was proved by the oath of George Williams and Charles C. C. Drittle two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the petition of Watson Taylor one of the executors therein named who made oath and together with John Rankin, Nathan B. Bryant, Henry Taylor and James Meland his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form, liberty being reserved for the other executor therein named to be joined in the said probate when he thinks fit.

Ordered that John Warham, George Williams, James Small and Mark T. Peck in any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal and real estate of James Taylor dec'd in this County, where to there may be produced or shown and return the appraisement under their hands to Court -

An Inventory and Appraisement of Robert T. Husgraves estate was returned and ordered to be recorded -

A Willing bearing date the 25th day of March 1839 purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Thomas Ridley deceased was produced in Court and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto William B. Goodwyn and George B. Long being sworn severally depose and swear that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Thomas Ridley and verily believe the body of the said writing together with the signature thereto to be in the hand writing of the said Thomas Ridley deceased. Whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as and for the last will and Testament of the said Thomas Ridley deceased and there being no executor named in the said Will on the petition of Thomas Ridley who made oath and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two hundred thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs (the Court with the consent of Robert Ridley one of the legates not requiring security) certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration in the said decedent's estate with his will affirmed annexed in due form -
