By consent of the parties and with the assent of the Court, this cause came on this day to be heard on the bill, answer and exhibits filed, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that John C. Nicholson, Charles Hart, Benjamin Hart and Eldridge C. Atkinson or any three of them who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose after giving two days notice of the time and place of sale, by advertisement posted up at the front door of the Courthouse of this County, and at two or more public places near to the place appointed for the sale, proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder, for ready money, the following Slaves Diz Sampson, Nave Albert, Myatt, Anney, Susan, Abby, Becca, Lly, Caroline, Waller, Peyton, Oliver, Tom, Georganna, and Cordius in the bill mentioned, being the slaves lately held by Jane Hart dec<sup>d</sup> the widow and legatee of John Hart dec<sup>d</sup> deceased. And the said Commissioners, or such of them as may act, are then directed to deduct from the gross amount of sales, the incidental charges and expenses attendant on the sales and costs of suit and apply the same to the persons entitled thereto. That after making the deduction aforesaid, the said Commissioners or such of them as may act will then divide the net amount of sales into six equal parts or shares, and pay over one of the said sixth parts or shares unto each of the Complainants. One other of the said sixth parts they will pay over to the defendant Charles Hart in his own right, and one sixth part is to be paid over to the said Charles Hart as executor of John Hart dec<sup>d</sup>, and the remaining Sixth part or share which belonged to the deceased infant Samuel Hart is to be subdivided into five parts and one of the said parts to be paid over to each of the Complainants except the Complainant Eldridge C. Atkinson administrator of who is not entitled in this Sixth part, one other of the said parts to the defendant Charles Hart.
