

being fully heard. It is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendants the sum of fourteen dollars and forty four cents with interest thereon from the 26<sup>th</sup> day of December 1859 till paid and her costs by her about her suit in this behalf expended. And that the Constable make sale of the property aforesaid attached and out of the monies arising from such sale pay and satisfy this judgment to the plaintiff and the residue of any surplus to the defendants and make return of such sale to Court.

A writing bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of December 1859 purporting the last Will and Testament of Benjamin M Hancock dec<sup>d</sup> was produced in Court and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto A. D. Burgess, Robert Drury, Samuel M Ford and Thos H Bell being sworn severally deposed and said they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the testator that they truly believe the said writing as well as the signature thereto to be the hand writing of the said Benjamin M Hancock whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be read as and for the last Will and Testament of the said Benjamin M Hancock dec<sup>d</sup> and a motion of William D Ford who is appointed administrator of the said will who made an oath with Samuel Drury, Nicholas M Tobell and James D. Hagerberg his co-administrators and acknowledged a bond on the penalty of Twenty thousand dollars to be as the law directs Certificate as granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the said Benjamin M Hancock's estate with his said will annexed in due form.

Ordered that William D Bailey, Jesse L Bailey, Richard A Wells and John C. Bell three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do affirm the personal estate of Benjamin M Hancock dec<sup>d</sup> and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

A deed of bargain and sale from Benjamin Lamb and Susan his wife to John A. Lamb was acknowledged by the said Benjamin Lamb and together with a certificate thereof was duly examined and acknowledged by the wife ordered to be recorded.

John Hart is appointed surveyor of the road from the Cross roads at Waplesburg to the house of Calvin D. Hunt runned and it is ordered that the usual bounds be set.

On the petition of George H Gardner guardian to Elizabeth M Gardner and Margaret A Gardner. Ordered that the guardian be permitted to sue the said Elizabeth and Margaret as principals of their estate for their support and clothing the last year of the year 1859. The Court that the interest of their estate is insufficient for that purpose.

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs of Harris Bridge over the flat swamp at the mouth of the river a report which is ordered to be recorded and is in the following words to wit: The undersigned being duly sworn and directed an order from the County Court to them was directed an order from the County Court of Southampton for the rebuilding Harris Bridge across the flat swamp at the mouth of the river a report to the said County Court that we proceeded to give notice of the same and to the following and that Sir Whitehead became the undertaker for the sum of One hundred and sixty dollars, and that the work has been done agreeable to contract and the work is done.
