It is ordered that the Owners of the Servs in the opinion of Notting Parish or any two of them James and Nicholas two free negro boys to William O'Neale until they respectively arrive to twenty one years of age - that the Owners of said Covenants with the said O'Neale that he pay to the mother of the said Servs the sum of twenty two dollars and fifty cents per year for said James and twelve dollars per year for said Nicholas during the apprenticeship except the last year which amount for last year are to be paid to the said apprentices.

Accounts of William Hibbs guardianship of Eliza Bryant. James Bryant Mary Bryant and Catharine Bryant were returned and ordered to be recorded.

An Inventory and Appraisement of Peter I Pierce estate was returned and ordered recorded.

This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioner appointed by the minister  
of state in this cause at December Court 1858 to make the division and allotment in the  
land mentioned this day made a report which is ordered to be recorded and is as follows  
In pursuance to the aforesaid decree bearing date Decr Court 1858 to wit do we the aforesaid  
Elizabeth Pierce the widow of Peter I Pierce one third of the Lands of which she and her  
husband Peter I Pierce died seized as also to allot to the said Elizabeth Pierce as her  
share of the estate of said decd. do hereby report that the deceased held two parcels of  
land, the one tract containing by the aforesaid plat made by the deceased surveyor alone  
settled on by us for this purpose 121 acres and the other tract it appeared from information  
made to us by the parties, was held for two hundred and twenty eight acres and in  
viewing the value of the said two tracts of land we agreed to apportion to the said Elizabeth  
the former tract containing 121 acres as her share. We also have allotted to her wife the  
negroes Jack, Bartelle, Ned, Angelina, and Mannie and child valued at \$250 and  
a \$50 over for proportion the whole valuation amounted to \$6800 and her
