

the County Court of Southampton at February Court 1828 your Commissioners proceeded on Tuesday the 27th day of Feb: and first set apart the slaves of Martha Cobb in the lands of which her late husband David Cobb died seized and possessed by a devise beginning at a dead fence in Ash Cobb's line running thence S 30° E 180 poles to a pine, with privilege to go on any part of the lands not herein included and get fire wood and rail timber for the use of the lands - Your Commissioners then proceeded to divide all the aforesaid tract of land including the slaves, as represented in the above plot: between James Cobb and David Cobb by a devise commencing at a Willow oak stump, the trunk of which is lying on the earth, according to the terms of the will directing the division, running thence N 70° E 180 poles to a sweet gum, thence N 20° E 226 poles to a white oak in Jeph Gardner's line, thence N 45° W 45 poles to a point a corner of W^m Edwards on Jeph Gardner's line along said W^m Edwards line due North 70 poles to a large white oak, thence N 45° W 45 poles to a red oak, thence N 75° W 74 poles to a pine, thence N 25° W 40 poles to a point at the divide, thence N 25° W 70 poles to the beginning containing 155 acres and denominated Lot No 1 as expressed in the aforesaid plot, which was known by James Cobb.

All Lot No 2 as represented in the plot was known by David Cobb and is bounded and bounded as follows: Beginning at the aforesaid Willow oak stump thence N 50° E 54 poles, thence N 29° E 28 poles, N 75° W 70 poles, N 45° E 26 poles to a pine, thence N 84° E 12 poles to a pine a corner of Brian Vaughan and Victor Eley, thence S 34° E 66 poles to a white oak, then S 28° E 34 poles to a pine thence S 15° E 46 poles, thence due South 94 poles to a pine, thence S 21° E 20 poles to a pine, thence S 9° E 20 poles, thence due S 16 poles to a pine a corner of Jeph Gardner and Willis W Lawrence, thence S 88° W 40 poles to a white oak, James Cobb's corner, thence along the new dividing line N 20° W 226 poles to a sweet gum James Cobb's corner, thence N 70° W 45 poles to the beginning containing 155 acres privilege is also given David to remove the old dwelling house now standing on the demesne of his lot, David he thanks for his services, but at his own expense. Your Commissioners then allotted and set apart to the widow, Martha Cobb, as and for her slaves for life, the following slaves namely Zerina the older valued at the sum of £165.00
Her value at 800.00

and Elender valued at

Total valuation £1180.00

all the rest quiet one third in value which the widow said she was satisfied and desired us to add no more to her. We then delivered to her the negro girl Zerina the younger, specifically bequeathed to her, and took her receipt for the same -

Your Commissioners then valued each lot of land as represented in the aforesaid plot
at the sum of £155.00

and valued the girl Esther allotted to David Cobb at the sum of £75.00 leaving a balance to be added to the value of the slaves of £75.00

Your Commissioners then valued the residue of the slaves as follows: Venus at £25.00
Hannah £25.00
Peter £30.00
Hiram £25.00

Balance of Esters valuation £5.00

£ 2600.00

One third of which is £ 866.66 2
